1. Where is money created?

A: Money is created at The Bureau of Engraving and Printing, also known as the Money Factory.

2. What is one example of a hand-drawn icon on a printed bill?

A: One example of a hand-drawn icon is an eagle.

3. Once the design is finalized, how is the image transferred to the bill?

A: A script engraver puts the finalized design into the steel plates that are used to print the image onto the bill.

4. What is the final step of the printing process?

A: The final step of the printing process is putting on the Serial number and the federal and treasury seals.

5. Where is the newly printed money stored?

A: Money is stored in the Federal Reserve Vault.
